Frozen Donor Eggs vs. Fresh Donor Eggs

To achieve pregnancy, 50% success depends on the quality of the egg. This suggests that eggs produced by a woman less than 32 years old have a better chance of developing into a healthy embryo.

How Does Egg Donation Improve Fertility?

Women with diminished fertility potential due to advancing age or poor egg quality may be advised to use "younger eggs" from a donor to improve their chance of pregnancy. An egg donor is a healthy young woman who agrees to provide her biological eggs to be inseminated by the sperm of the intended mother's partner.

The resulting embryos are then inserted in the uterus of the intended mother to be carried as her own pregnancy. The child will possess the physical traits of the father and the traits of the donor (chosen because she looks similar to the mother). At birth, the child is considered the biological offspring of the intended mother just like a naturally occurring pregnancy.
